

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Students who wish to enter the Chiropractic field can do so via Manor's Allied Health transfer degree program. After completion of 65 credits, plus an additional 25 credits, 15 of which must be in humanities/social sciences electives, students are prepared to transfer to a chiropractic college for their Doctor of Chiropractic degree. All courses can be completed at Manor College.

## WHY YOU SHOULD CHOOSE MANOR

## ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Manor continually reviews and accepts applications, making it easy to become part of our community. In addition to the general admissions criteria for Manor College, students admitted to the Allied Health Transfer programs must have successfully completed:

- 1 yr. of biology with lab and one year of chemistry with lab at the high school level with grades of C or better.
- At least 2 yrs. of high school level math including Algebra or 1 college level algebra course with grades of C or better.
- A minimum high school GPA of 2.7 and a combined SAT score (critical reading plus mathematics) of 750 or better.

TIP: Apply sooner than later! With our rolling admissions policy, we process applications throughout the year in the order received. This means more certainty in your future, as you'll receive an admissions decision within two weeks of completing all procedures.

You'll also be further along in the enrollment process, which improves your chances for scholarships and financial aid and for getting your first selections for class times and professors.

Chiropractors diagnose and treat disorders associated with muscular, skeletal, and nervous systems, especially in the spine. Chiropractors provide natural, drug-free, non-surgical treatments for patients and when appropriate refer patients to other health care professionals.
