WHY YOU SHOULD CHOOSE MANOR

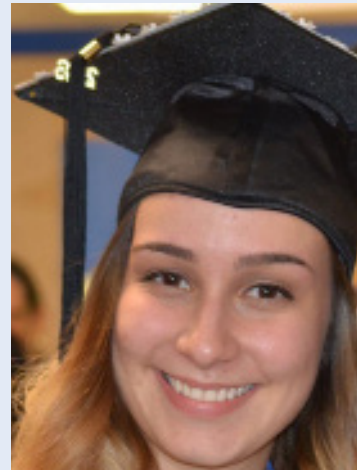

Students will gain valuable hands-on experience in laboratory which will help them succeed after transferring to a baccalaureate program.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Manor continually reviews and accepts applications, making it easy to become part of our community. In addition to the general admissions criteria for Manor College, students admitted to the Allied Health Transfer programs must have successfully completed:

- 1 year of biology with lab and one year of chemistry with lab at the high school level with grades of C or better
- At least two years of high school level math including Algebra or one college level algebra course with grades of C or better
- A combined SAT score (critical reading plus mathematics) of 840 or better
- Preference will be given to applicants who rank in the tough half of their graduating class, have an overall GPA of 3.0 or better, and have an SAT score of 900

TIP: Apply sooner than later! With our rolling admissions policy, we process applications throughout the year in the order received. This means more certainty in your future, as you'll receive an admissions decision within two weeks of completing all procedures.
