It is important to study each day over a long period of time rather than complete all of the homework in a short period of time via cramming (refer to far left-hand column above for due dates of question completion). Students will be penalized during weeks when 150 questions were not completed. The completed Math Packet and the Pharmacy/Drug Diary will be due at the third and final on-campus externship meeting.
