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### **Admissions Requirements:**

Manor continually reviews and accepts applications, making it easy to become part of our community. In addition to the general admissions criteria, students admitted into the Nursing Transfer program must have successfully completed:

- 1 year of biology with lab and one year of chemistry with lab at the high school level with grades of C or better
- At least two years of high school level math including Algebra or one college level algebra course with grades of C or better
- A combined SAT score (critical reading plus mathematics) of 840 or better
- An overall GPA of 2.7 or higher
- Preference will be given to applicants who rank in the top half of their graduating class, have an overall GPA of 3.0 or better, and have an SAT score of 900.

TIP: Apply sooner rather than later! With our rolling admissions policy, we process applications throughout the year in the order received. This means more certainty in your future, as you'll receive an admissions decision within two weeks of completing all procedures.

Manor continually reviews and acccepts applications, making it easy to become part of our community. In addition to the general admissions criteria for Manor College, EFDA students must have successfully completed 2 yrs of Math, 1 yr of Biology, 1 yr of Chemistry/Lab in high school with a minimum GPA of 2.5. A minimum of 650 (V+M or CR+M) on the SAT is required. If applicable, a minimum GPA of 2.5 in previous college work is required. A personal interview with the EFDA Program Director is also required.
