PRACTICAL NURSING

Upon completion of the Practical Nursing Program, graduates will be eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN) administered by the Pennsylvania Board of Nursing. Additionally, Manor College will confer an Associate of Science degree.

Practical Nursing is a rapidly growing profession with tremendous needs for caring, well-qualified individuals. Practical nurses can perform tasks and responsibilities within the framework of health teaching, health counseling and provisions of supportive and restorative care under the direction of a registered nurse or other legally authorized health care professional.

The need for LPNs in the workforce

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry, employment opportunities in the nursing field are growing 10.7 percent nationally and more than 16 percent in the Philadelphia metro area.

Practical nursing is **nursing at its most interactive form with patients**. Practical nurses are supervised by a higher-level licensed provider, usually a registered nurse or a medical doctor. They provide basic nursing care and are able to be certified in other tasks like IV therapy.
