NOTES:

1. Students will apply to La Salle via the Dual Admission Application at the beginning of their program at Manor and would need to indicate their interest in this specialized program. They can do this online for free at www.lasalle.edu.
2. At the end of year 1, students must possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 as well as a 3.0 science GPA. They must also provide acceptable TEAS exam (58.7%) or SAT/ACT scores (SAT=1080) to progress in La Salle program.
3. All nursing (NUR) courses MUST be completed with at least a C+ or better in each course as well as maintaining a 2.75 La Salle GPA. Manor GPA must stay 3.0 in order to progress in the program as well.
